




We just want to thank you for being a Registered Texan and always remembering to “Put Texas in your corner.” Your registration fee helps to build and maintain Texas’ roads and bridges. About a third of your fee stays in your home county for local road projects. Don’t forget in many counties you can renew online at www.texas.gov. UNDERSTANDING REMARKS ON YOUR RENEWAL NOTICE

You may not be able to renew your vehicle registration if the front of this renewal notice has any of these remarks:

“LEGAL RESTRAINT - CONTACT TxDMV”

There is a problem with your vehicle registration and/or title record. You must contact the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles, (512) 465-7611.

“COUNTY SCOFFLAW: (County Name)”

Your county notified us that you owe the county for a fine, fee or tax that is past due. Contact your local county tax office or the department listed on the violation.

“CITY SCOFFLAW: (City Name)”

The city named notified us that you have an outstanding warrant for failure to appear in court for a traffic violation, or owe money for a Red Light Camera violation. Contact the county tax office or municipal court in the city indicated.

“TCEQ - EMISSIONS PRGM NON-COMPLIANCE”

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) requires your vehicle to pass emissions testing. To register your vehicle, you must show it passed emissions testing by taking an original Vehicle Inspection Report, which is given to you at a certified Vehicle Inspection Station, to your local county tax office. “DPS - EMISSIONS PRGM NON-COMPLIANCE”

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) sent you a letter with instructions to have your vehicle’s emissions tested. You must take an original Vehicle Inspection Report, which is given to you at a certified Vehicle Inspection Station, to your local county tax office in order to register your vehicle.

VEHICLE INSURANCE VERIFICATION

In Texas, “if you’re not covered, you’ll be discovered.” Registered Texans must carry the state’s minimum amount of insurance coverage. The state’s database electronically tracks whether your insurance is up-to-date.

When you renew by mail, you still must send a **copy of your insurance card**. When you renew online at www.texas.gov, the database will automatically check your insurance status.

TEXAS VEHICLE EMISSIONS TESTING AND DRIVER LICENSE ISSUANCE

Vehicle emissions testing is required in designated Texas counties. The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) administers the program.

DPS also issues and renews the Texas Driver License.

To find a certified Vehicle Inspection Station or renew your driver license, go to www.txdps.state.tx.us.

FEDERAL HEAVY VEHICLE USE TAX

Owners of heavy commercial vehicles weighing 55,000 pounds or more must show proof that they comply with the Federal Heavy Use Tax requirements in order to be eligible for registration.

NOTICE OF FEDERAL MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY AND HAZARDOUS MATERIAL REGULATIONS

Payment of your required registration fee is a declaration of knowledge that Texas has adopted and enforces the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations and Hazardous Material Regulations and it is your (registrant’s) obligation to be familiar with all applicable requirements.

This obligation applies to owners of:

- Vehicles (including Farm Vehicles) weighing over 10,000 pounds
- Vehicles transporting 15 or more passengers
- Vehicles transporting hazardous material requiring a placard

Protect your title, Texas.

Your vehicle title needs maintenance, too.



Protect your title, Texas. When you sell or trade in a vehicle, be sure to:

- File the free Vehicle Transfer Notification online at www.TxDmv.gov.
- Transfer your license plates to the new vehicle you are purchasing (be sure to also remove your registration sticker).

DISABLED PARKING PLACARDS AND/OR PLATES

Qualified applicants apply for disabled parking placards and/or license plates at their local county tax office. You must bring a completed **Form VTR-214** that is either notarized by your physician’s office or submitted with your physician’s prescription.
